Flashbacks

In front of me, the pre-phylloxera Riesling vines stand as tall as I am, their trunks as wide as me... Walking through the rows of Scharzhofberger vines, Egon's words echo in my mind: "The quality of a wine originates from the vines."

Egon comes back from the cellar with a bottle, its label absent. He opens it carefully, concealing the cork. As he pours the liquid into our glasses, a mischievous smile plays on his lips:

"So, what vintage is it?"

Several answers fly, pointing to the late '90s or early 2000s.

Egon smiles, calmly, and softly replies: "1983."

Time seems to have no hold over Egon's wines. In retrospect, I can't help but think there must be a time glitch in his cellar.

The Alte Reben cuvée comes from the ungrafted parcels at the heart of the Scharzhofberger site, long believed to be resistant to phylloxera thanks to their unique terroir. We now know that this resilience was due largely to the cold temperatures, as some vines have recently begun to show signs of infestation and have had to be replaced. Alte Reben is unique in its fragility, and future generations will likely read about it rather than have the chance to experience its recent vintages firsthand.

Each cuvée tells its own story, yet all are written from the same book.

The whole table was in stitches and I hoped he was joking—but it turns out, he wasn’t.

From this anecdote, I realize there is no perfect moment to open a bottle of wine. Life is a series of fleeting moments, each unique yet bound to repeat in an eternal return.

This estate stands out as unconventional, even rebellious, in its approach. It embraces biodynamic practices, vinifies with stems, adopts varied ageing periods tailored to each wine, and resolutely avoids filtration and fining. Managing only a select few vineyards, the domaine focuses exclusively on producing red wines, amplifying its distinct identity.

The Conti spirit, therefore, is above all: the attention given to the vintage is crucial, but the terroir is so determinant, and the hand of man is decisive.

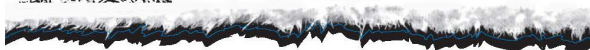

Éloi Dürrbach, a true visionary and free spirit, transformed his terroir by using a bulldozer to break large stone blocks, creating a mosaic of pebbles over the clay-limestone foundation of his iconic Alpilles vineyard. He firmly believed in the potential of blending Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah to craft exceptional Provençal reds, which led him to step away from the Baux-de-Provence appellation. Initially, selling his wine was a significant challenge for him, as he navigated uncharted territory.

Aubert de Villaine discovered the estate, setting off a chain reaction. Kermit Lynch tasted the wine, bought 10 cases, then 100, and introduced it to Robert Parker. Parker, in turn, found a true revelation in the heart of Les Baux de Provence, a new-found passion.

The rest, as they say, is history.
